Building Committee

With the removal of the power poles the club was able to apply for funding to enable the renovation of the toilet block to proceed. Grant applications were lodged with Rata Foundation and NZCT for the full cost of the project. Unfortunately these were declined so the Building Committee will meet to discuss how they can move forward on further applications.

A group of members has been formed to help Harley with the rolling and other maintenance on the greens. The spraying for moss is continuing and it is having good results. Seaweed fertiliser is being applied to encourage growth and control weeds. A new transmission has been fitted to the roller at a cost of \$2294. This will ensure that one of the most used pieces of machinery in the club is fit for purpose and reliable.

The lawn mowing and grounds teams have been hard at work and as usual the club is looking great. Well done to all the volunteers. I must say what a difference the renewal and painting of the seats has made. Well done Bernie Fahey for his work over the winter for doing this.

Financial Report

The club is financially in a good position and with the subscriptions currently being paid our cash flow is positive. Remember that to play in Inter-club and the Club Championships your subscription must be current. **The closing date for subscriptions is 31 October 2024.** We were successful with a grant for our Greenkeepers wages from **Pub Charities** and we thank them for their support.

Our insurance policy has seen a \$2500 increase on last year and like all insurance the premiums keep climbing. However it's important that the clubs assets are fully covered.

Our Treasurer Jeanette Brant has had a difficult task transferring our banking to Westpac and she is still not comfortable with the change. There have been a number of problems and let's hope that these can be sorted soon. Thanks Jeanette for your patience in dealing with this matter.
