Message from our President

Dear Members

Well, the weather once again has interrupted the start to our 2025 bowling year and indeed the recovery of the Fergusson Green, however here's hoping the weather improves for the beginning of the interclub rounds in the coming weeks and good luck to all the teams. It is great to see so many members representing the club in these various competitions.

The New Year triples tournament was a great success and we do hope to have more fun and competitive internal tournaments such as this but with championship matches and interclub commitments just finding a day on which we can get a reasonable number needs to be looked in to. Just a reminder to keep the championship matches rolling along as it will be no time before we need to provide names to the Centre for the Champion of Champions events.

The Incorporated Societies Act 2022 requires all incorporated societies, amongst which are clubs such as ours, to have a new constitution by April 2026 and there are many reasons that we must remain on this register but the main ones are - retaining our own separate legal identity, the ability to own property, enter into contracts as an entity and apply for funding. I am working on a draft document for the subcommittee to review and then once finalised it will be circulated to members for comment and presented for approval at the AGM in May.

You may all be wondering what is happening about the proposed toilet block but progress has been thwarted once again due to our second attempt at seeking funding being declined. Another sign of the current economic situation is that funding is becoming increasingly difficult to source but the Building Committee and Executive are determined to continue the project in stages where we would put in an accessible toilet (which is becoming absolutely essential and not a wish list item), and refurbish the changing rooms first. As all of the design work and subsequent current plans have been funded we have not used any club funding to date and intend to go down this path.

The soft ware was developed by a Burnside member and has been around for some years. The idea behind it is that it will assist in running tournaments by doing a draw, printing cards for each game and tabulating the results to give a winner. We have to thank Ian McPherson and Bob Davison for setting this up. It has been used for two club tournaments recently and proved very successful. The Business House tournament will use this system and this will cut down on the amount of work needed to get and show the results.

The system has other possibilities and Ian will be researching these to see where the club can use it to eliminate some of the work re draws and results. The results can be shown on a computer screen so everyone knows where they are in the tournament. A great advancement for the club.
